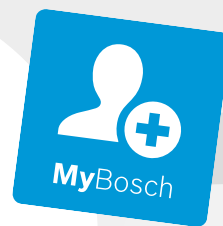

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INFORMATION FOR USE

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1 Safety

Observe the following safety instructions.

1.1 General information

- Read this instruction manual carefully.
- Keep the instruction manual and the product information safe for future reference or for the next owner.
- Do not connect the appliance if it has been damaged in transit.

1.2 Intended use

Only use this appliance:

- For extracting cooking vapour.
- in private households and in enclosed spaces in a domestic environment.
- up to an altitude of max. 4000 m above sea level.

1.3 Restriction on user group

This appliance may be used by children aged 8 or over and by people who have reduced physical, sensory or mental abilities or inadequate experience and/or knowledge, provided that they are supervised or have been instructed on how to use the appliance

safely and have understood the resulting dangers.

Do not let children play with the appliance. Children must not perform cleaning or user maintenance unless they are at least 15 years old and are being supervised. Keep children under the age of 8 years away from the appliance and power cable.

1.4 Safe use

WARNING – Risk of fire!

Fatty deposits in the grease filters may catch fire.

- ▶ Never operate the appliance without a grease filter.
- ▶ Clean the grease filters regularly.
- ▶ Never work with naked flames close to the appliance (e.g. flambéing).
- ▶ Do not install the appliance near a solid fuel heating appliance (e.g. wood- or coal-burning) unless the heating appliance has a sealed, non-removable cover. There must be no flying sparks.

Hot oil and fat ignites very quickly.

- ▶ Always supervise hot oil and fat.

- ▶ Never extinguish burning oil or fat with water. Switch off the hotplate. Extinguish flames carefully using a lid, fire blanket or something similar and leave to cool down.

When gas burners are in operation without any cookware placed on them, they can build up a lot of heat. A ventilation appliance installed above the cooker may become damaged or catch fire.

- ▶ Only operate the gas burners with cookware on them.

Operating multiple gas hobs at the same time generates a great deal of heat. A ventilation appliance installed above the cooker may become damaged or catch fire.

- ▶ Only operate the gas hobs with cookware on them.
- ▶ Select the highest fan setting.
- ▶ Never operate two gas hobs simultaneously on the highest flame for longer than 15 minutes. Two gas hobs correspond to one large burner.
- ▶ Never operate large burners of more than 5 kW with the highest flame for longer than 15 minutes, e.g. a wok.

Fatty deposits in the grease filters may catch fire.

- ▶ Clean the grease filters regularly.

⚠ WARNING – Risk of suffocation!

Children may put packaging material over their heads or wrap themselves up in it and suffocate.

- ▶ Keep packaging material away from children.
- ▶ Do not let children play with packaging material.

Children may breathe in or swallow small parts, causing them to suffocate.

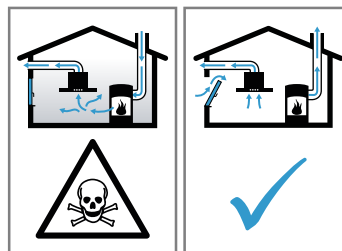
- ▶ Keep small parts away from children.
- ▶ Do not let children play with small parts.

⚠ WARNING – Risk of poisoning!

Risk of poisoning from flue gases being drawn back in. Room-air-dependent heat-producing appliances (e.g. gas, oil, wood or coal-operated heaters, continuous flow heaters or water heaters) obtain combustion air from the room in which they are installed and discharge the exhaust gases into the open through an exhaust gas system (e.g. a chimney). With the extractor hood switched on, air is extracted from the kitchen and the adjacent rooms.

Without an adequate supply of air, the air pressure falls below atmospheric pressure. Toxic

gases from the chimney or the extraction shaft are sucked back into the living space.



- ▶ Always ensure adequate fresh air in the room if the appliance is being operated in exhaust air mode at the same time as a room-air-dependent heat-producing appliance is being operated.
- ▶ It is only possible to safely operate the appliance if the pressure in the room in which the heating appliance is installed does not fall below 4 Pa (0.04 mbar). This can be achieved whenever the air needed for combustion is able to enter through openings that cannot be sealed, for example in doors, windows, incoming/exhaust air wall boxes or by other technical means. An incoming/exhaust air wall box alone is not sufficient to ensure compliance with the limit.
- ▶ In any case, consult your responsible chimney sweep. They are able to assess the house's entire ventilation setup and will suggest the suitable ventilation measures to you.
- ▶ Unrestricted operation is possible if the appliance is operated exclusively in circulating-air mode.

Using a gas cooking appliance leads to a build-up of heat, moisture and combustion products in the room where the appliance is installed.

- ▶ Switch on the extractor hood when using a gas cooking appliance.

⚠ WARNING – Risk of burns!

The accessible parts of the appliance become hot during operation.

- ▶ Never touch these hot parts.
- ▶ Keep children at a safe distance.

The appliance becomes hot during operation.

- ▶ Allow the appliance to cool down before cleaning.

⚠ WARNING – Risk of injury!

Components inside the appliance may have sharp edges.

- ▶ Carefully clean the appliance interior. Items placed on the appliance may fall off.
- ▶ Do not place any objects on the appliance.

Changes to the electrical or mechanical assembly are dangerous and may lead to malfunctions.

- ▶ Do not make any changes to the electrical or mechanical assembly.

The filter cover may swing out.

- ▶ Open the filter cover slowly.
- ▶ Take hold of the filter cover after opening until it no longer swings out.
- ▶ Close the filter cover slowly.

Risk of injury when opening and closing the hinges.

- ▶ Keep your hands away from the hinges.

The light emitted by LED lights is very dazzling, and can damage the eyes (risk group 1).

- ▶ Do not look directly into the switched-on LED lights for longer than 100 seconds.

Improper repairs are dangerous.

- ▶ Repairs to the appliance should only be carried out by trained specialist staff.

- ▶ If the appliance is defective, call Customer Service.

⚠ WARNING – Risk of electric shock!

If the appliance or the power cord is damaged, this is dangerous.

- ▶ Never operate a damaged appliance.
- ▶ Never pull on the power cord to unplug the appliance. Always unplug the appliance at the mains.

- ▶ If the appliance or the power cord is damaged, immediately unplug the power cord or switch off the fuse in the fuse box.
 - ▶ Call customer services. → Page 13
- Improper repairs are dangerous.

- ▶ Repairs to the appliance should only be carried out by trained specialist staff.
- ▶ Only use genuine spare parts when repairing the appliance.
- ▶ If the power cord of this appliance is damaged, it must be replaced by trained specialist staff.

An ingress of moisture can cause an electric shock.

- ▶ Before cleaning, pull out the mains plug or switch off the fuse in the fuse box.
- ▶ Do not use steam- or high-pressure cleaners to clean the appliance.

Penetrating moisture may cause an electric shock.

- ▶ Do not use wet sponge cloths.

⚠ WARNING – Risk of explosion!

Highly caustic alkaline or highly acidic cleaning agents in conjunction with aluminium parts in the interior of the appliance may cause explosions.

- ▶ Never use highly caustic alkaline or highly acidic cleaning agents. In particular, do not use commercial or industrial cleaning agents in conjunction with aluminium parts, e.g. grease filter on extractor hoods.

2 Avoiding material damage

ATTENTION

Condensate may cause corrosion damage.

- ▶ To prevent condensation from building up, switch on the appliance during cooking.

If moisture gets into the controls, this may result in damage.

- ▶ Never clean controls with a wet cloth.

Incorrect cleaning damages the surfaces.

- ▶ Follow the cleaning instructions.
 - ▶ Do not use harsh or abrasive detergents.
 - ▶ Clean stainless steel surfaces in the direction of the finish only.
 - ▶ Never clean controls with stainless steel cleaners.
- Condensation that flows back in may damage the appliance.
- ▶ The air extraction duct must be installed with a gradient of at least 1° from the appliance.

If you put incorrect stress on the design elements, they may break off.

- ▶ Do not pull design elements.
- ▶ Do not place objects on the design elements or hang objects from them.

There is a risk of surface damage if you do not peel off the protective film.

- ▶ Remove the protective film from all parts of the appliance before using for the first time.

Painted surfaces are easily damaged.

- ▶ Follow the cleaning instructions.

- ▶ Ensure that the painted surfaces are not scratched.

3 Environmental protection and saving energy

3.1 Disposing of packaging

The packaging materials are environmentally compatible and can be recycled.

- ▶ Sort the individual components by type and dispose of them separately.

3.2 Saving energy

If you follow these instructions, your appliance will use less power.

Adjust the fan speed to the amount of steam produced during cooking.

- ✓ The lower the fan speed, the less energy is consumed.
- ✓ Only use the intensive mode as required.

If cooking produces large amounts of steam, select a higher fan speed in good time.

- ✓ The odours are distributed around the room less.

Switch off the lighting if it is no longer required.

- ✓ When the lighting is switched off, it does not consume any energy.

Clean or replace the filters at regular intervals.

- ✓ The effectiveness of the filter is retained.

Put the cooking lid on.

- ✓ The cooking vapours and condensation are reduced.

Only use the additional functions if required.

- ✓ Switching off additional functions reduces power consumption.

You can find product information in accordance with (EU) 65/2014 and (EU) 66/2014 below the energy label and online on the product page for your appliance.

4 Operating modes

You can use your appliance in air extraction mode or circulating-air mode.

4.1 Air extraction mode

The air which is drawn in is cleaned by the grease filters and conveyed to the exterior by a pipe system.



The air must not be discharged into a flue that is used for exhausting fumes from appliances burning gas or other fuels (not applicable to appliances that only discharge the air back into the room).

- If the exhaust air is to be conveyed into a non-functioning smoke or exhaust gas flue, you must obtain the consent of the heating engineer responsible.
- If the exhaust air is conveyed through the external wall, a telescopic duct should be used.

4.2 Air recirculation

The air which is drawn in is cleaned by the grease filters and an odour filter, and conveyed back into the room.

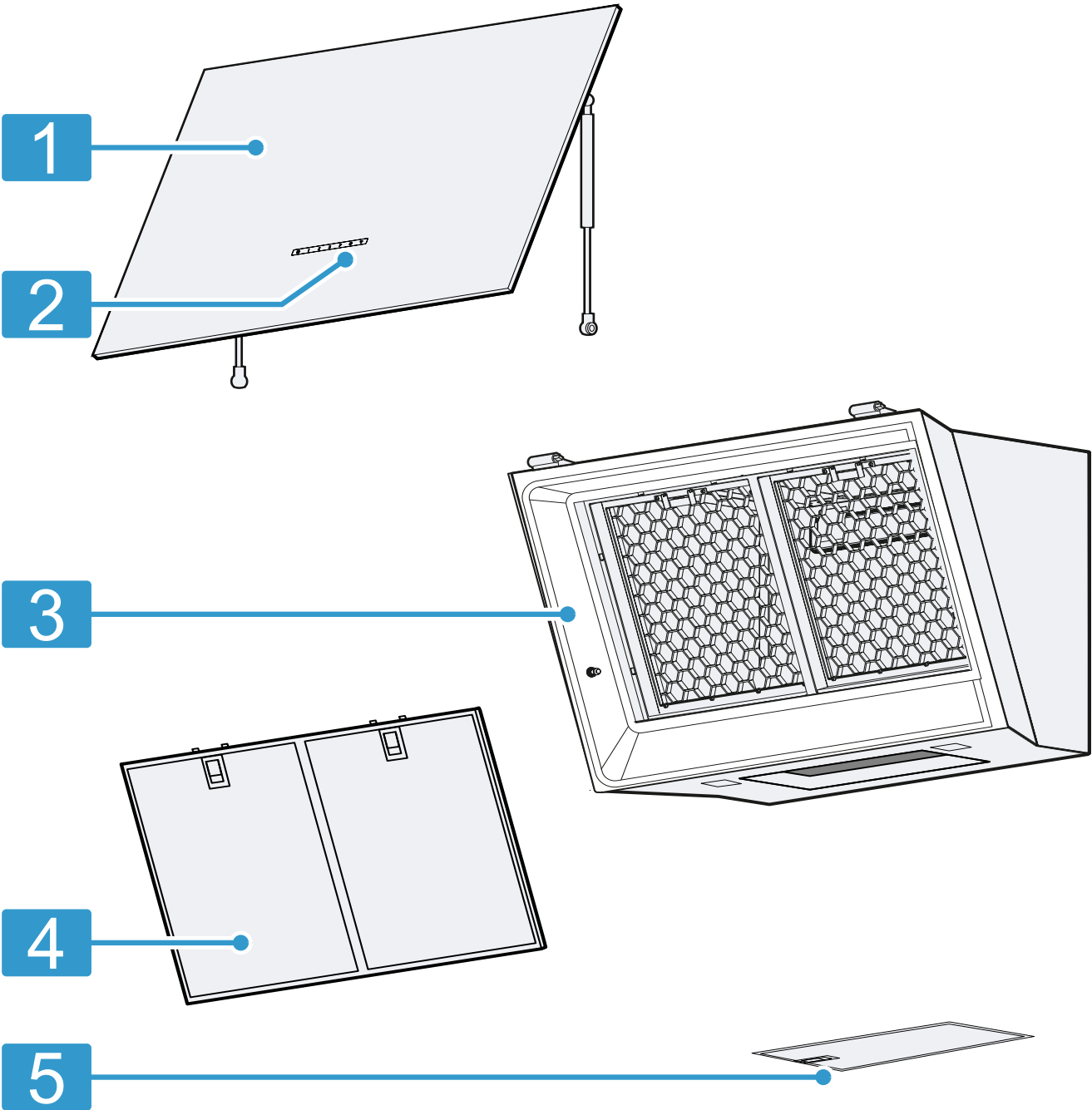


To bind odours in air recirculation mode, you must install an odour filter. The different options for operating the appliance in air circulation mode can be found in our catalogue. Alternatively, ask your dealer. The required accessories are available from specialist retailers, from our after-sales service or from the online shop. → "Accessories", Page 13

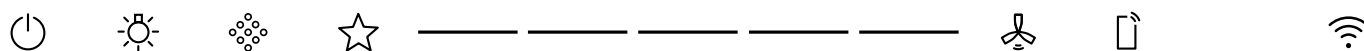

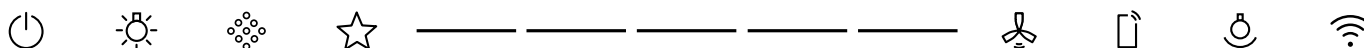

6 Before using for the first time

Configure the settings for initial start-up. Clean the appliance and accessories.

6.1 Setting an operating mode

Your appliance is set to air extraction mode by default.

Note: When using it in circulating-air mode, you require additional accessories.

- ▶ When using it in circulating-air mode, set the operating mode.

7 Basic operation

7.1 Switching on the appliance

- ▶ Press .
- ✓ The appliance starts at fan setting 2.

7.2 Switching off the appliance

- ▶ Press .

7.3 Selecting a fan setting

- ▶ Select the required fan setting in the settings area -----.

7.4 Switching on intensive mode

If particularly strong odours or vapours develop, you can use intensive mode.

- ▶ Select the required intensive mode in the settings area -----.
- ✓ After approx. 6 minutes, the appliance automatically switches to fan setting 3.

7.5 Switching off intensive mode

- ▶ Reset to the required fan setting.

7.6 Setting the PowerBoost position

On the appliance, the glass front can be adjusted to an intermediate position. The intermediate position should be used to eliminate particularly strong cooking smells and large amounts of steam.

- ▶ Take hold of the glass front in the centre and open it carefully.

7.7 Switching on automatic mode

The optimum fan setting is set automatically using a sensor.

- ▶ Press .

7.8 Switching off automatic mode

- ▶ Reset to the required fan setting.
- ✓ The ventilation is automatically ended when the sensor detects no further change in the room air quality.
- ✓ Automatic mode runs for a maximum of four hours.

7.9 Sensor sensitivity

In automatic mode, a sensor in the appliance detects the intensity of the cooking odours and roasting odours. Depending on the setting of the sensor sensitivity, the optimum fan setting is automatically switched on. You can change the sensor sensitivity setting in the Home Connect app.

- Factory setting: 3
- Lowest setting: 1
- Highest setting: 5

7.10 Switching on the lighting

The lighting can be switched on and off independently of the ventilation system.

- ▶ Press .

7.11 Setting the brightness

- ▶ Press and hold  until the required brightness is reached.

7.12 Switching on Decorative LED lighting

You can switch on the Decorative LED lighting independently of the ventilation system.

- ▶ Press .

7.13 Setting the Decorative LED lighting colour

Note: You can find other Decorative LED lighting colours and brightness settings in the Home Connect app.

- ▶ Press and hold  until the required colour is reached.

7.14 Saturation indicator

If the grease filters are saturated, the corresponding symbol flashes after the appliance is switched off.

Note: You can set the saturation indicator in the Home Connect app depending on the filter used.

Clean the saturated grease filters and observe the cleaning instructions in these instructions.

Change the saturated odour filters and observe the instructions in the Home Connect app.

If odour filters can be regenerated, follow the instructions in the accompanying instructions.

7.15 Resetting the saturation indicator

After cleaning the grease filters, the saturation indicator can be reset.

Note: You can find information on odour filter saturation in the Home Connect app.

Requirement: If the grease filters are saturated,  lights up after the appliance is switched off.

- ▶ Press .
- ✓ The saturation indicator is reset.

7.16 Selecting the favourites function

You can specify 2 favourites functions via the Home Connect app and then select these on your appliance.

Requirement: The appliance is connected to Home Connect.

1. To assign ☆ functions, follow the instructions in the Home Connect app.
2. To select the favourites function 1, press ☆ briefly.
3. To select the favourites function 2, press and hold ☆.

7.17 Remote display

You can use the Home Connect app to set functions for your appliance that are not illustrated on the control panel. If you carry out a function for which there is no display on the control panel, the remote display lights up .

8 Additional functions in the Home Connect app ¹

You can find these functions in the Home Connect app:

8.1 Automatic sensor system

The automatic sensor system activates the fan and individually adjusts the fan performance.

8.2 Decorative LED lighting

In the Home Connect app, you can select from a range of atmospheric colours, completely independently from the ventilation.

8.3 Performance profile

In the Home Connect app, you have the option to set your personal performance profile. You can choose between the noise-optimised or performance-optimised performance profile.

8.4 Filter saturation

You can set the saturation indicator in the Home Connect app depending on the filter used.

8.5 Cooktop-based Hood Control

You can connect your appliance to a Home Connect-compatible hob and, in this way, control the functions of your appliance via the hob.

8.6 Fan run-on

The fan run-on removes remaining odours and is used to dry the odour filter after the cooking process.

8.7 Interval ventilation

In order to regularly ventilate your kitchen, you can use the interval ventilation. With interval ventilation, the ventilation system switches on and off in the selected setting for the selected time.

8.8 Favourites button

You can specify 2 favourites functions via the Home Connect app and then select these on your appliance.

8.9 Voice Control

You can control your extractor hood using voice control with Amazon Alexa, for example.

8.10 Setting the colour temperature

In the Home Connect app, you can set the colour temperature for the light from cold to warm.

9 Home Connect

This appliance is network-capable. Connecting your appliance to a mobile device lets you control its functions via the Home Connect app, adjust its basic settings and monitor its operating status.

The Home Connect services are not available in every country. The availability of the Home Connect function depends on the availability of Home Connect services in your country. You can find information about this at: www.home-connect.com.

The Home Connect app guides you through the entire login process. Follow the instructions in the Home Connect app to configure the settings.

Tip: Please also follow the instructions in the Home Connect app.

Notes

- Please note the safety precautions in this instruction manual and make sure that they are also observed when operating the appliance via the Home Connect app.

- Operating the appliance on the appliance itself always takes priority. During this time it is not possible to operate the appliance using the Home Connect app.
- In networked standby mode, the appliance requires a maximum of 2 W.

9.1 Setting up the Home Connect app

1. Install the Home Connect app on your mobile device.
2. Start the Home Connect app and set up access for Home Connect.
The Home Connect app guides you through the entire login process.

9.2 Setting up Home Connect

Requirements

- The appliance is switched off.
 - You have a mobile device with a current version of the iOS or Android operating system, e.g. a smartphone.
 - The appliance is receiving signals from the WLAN home network (Wi-Fi) at its installation location.
 - The mobile device and the appliance are within range of your home network's Wi-Fi signal.
1. Scan the following QR code.



- You can install the Home Connect app and connect your appliance via the QR code.
2. Follow the instructions in the Home Connect app.

9.3 Resetting the connection

Requirement: The appliance is switched off.

- To reset the saved connections to the home network and to Home Connect, press and hold  twice.

9.4 Software update

Your appliance's software can be updated using the software update function, e.g. for the purposes of optimisation, troubleshooting or security updates.

To do this, you must be a registered Home Connect user, have installed the app on your mobile device and be connected to the Home Connect server.

As soon as a software update is available, you will be informed via the Home Connect app and will be able to start the software update via the app. Once the update has been successfully downloaded, you can start installing it via the Home Connect app if you are in your home network (Wi-Fi). The Home Connect app informs you once installation is successful.

Notes

- The software update consists of two steps.
 - The first step is the download.
 - The second step is the installation on your appliance.
- You can continue to use your appliance as normal while updates are downloading. Depending on your personal settings in the app, software updates can also be set to download automatically.
- Installation takes a few minutes. You cannot use your appliance during installation.
- We recommend that you install security updates as soon as possible.

9.5 Remote diagnostics

Customer Service can use Remote Diagnostics to access your appliance if you contact them, have your ap-

pliance connected to the Home Connect server and if Remote Diagnostics is available in the country in which you are using the appliance.

9.6 Data protection

Please see the information on data protection.

The first time your appliance is registered on a home network connected to the Internet, your appliance will transmit the following types of data to the Home Connect server (initial registration):

- Unique appliance identification (consisting of appliance codes as well as the MAC address of the Wi-Fi communication module installed).
- Security certificate of the Wi-Fi communication module (to ensure a secure data connection).
- The current software and hardware version of your appliance.
- Status of any previous reset to factory settings.

This initial registration prepares the Home Connect functions for use and is only required when you want to use the Home Connect functions for the first time.

Note: Please note that the Home Connect functions can only be utilised with the Home Connect app. Information on data protection can be retrieved in the Home Connect app.

10 Hob-based hood control

You can connect your appliance to a suitable hob and, in this way, control the functions of your appliance via the hob.

If the hob and the extractor hood are Home Connect-compatible, connect the two appliances to Home Connect and follow the instructions in the app.

Notes

- Please note the safety precautions in the instruction manual for your appliance and ensure that they are

also observed when operating the appliance via the hob-based hood control.

- Operating your appliance always takes priority. It is not possible to use the hob-based hood control during this time.
- You can only connect to the extractor hood via the Home Connect app.

11 Cleaning and servicing

To keep your appliance working efficiently for a long time, it is important to clean and maintain it carefully.

11.1 Cleaning products

You can obtain suitable cleaning products from after-sales service or the online shop.

⚠ WARNING – Risk of electric shock!

An ingress of moisture can cause an electric shock.

- ▶ Before cleaning, pull out the mains plug or switch off the fuse in the fuse box.
- ▶ Do not use steam- or high-pressure cleaners to clean the appliance.

⚠ WARNING – Risk of burns!

The appliance becomes hot during operation.

- ▶ Allow the appliance to cool down before cleaning.

ATTENTION

Unsuitable cleaning products may damage the surfaces of the appliance.

- ▶ Do not use harsh or abrasive detergents.
- ▶ Do not use cleaning products with a high alcohol content.
- ▶ Do not use hard scouring pads or cleaning sponges.
- ▶ Only use glass cleaners, glass scrapers or stainless steel care products if recommended in the cleaning instructions for the relevant part.

- ▶ Wash sponge cloths thoroughly before use.

11.2 Cleaning the appliance

Clean the appliance as specified. This will ensure that the different parts and surfaces of the appliance are not damaged by incorrect cleaning or unsuitable cleaning products.

⚠ **WARNING – Risk of explosion!**

Highly caustic alkaline or highly acidic cleaning agents in conjunction with aluminium parts in the interior of the appliance may cause explosions.

- ▶ Never use highly caustic alkaline or highly acidic cleaning agents. In particular, do not use commercial or industrial cleaning agents in conjunction with aluminium parts, e.g. grease filter on extractor hoods.

2. Clean as follows, depending on the surface:
 - ▶ Clean stainless steel surfaces in the direction of the finish using a sponge cloth and hot soapy water.
 - ▶ Clean painted surfaces using a damp sponge cloth and hot soapy water.
 - ▶ Clean aluminium using a soft cloth and glass cleaner.
 - ▶ Clean plastic using a soft cloth and glass cleaner.
 - ▶ Clean glass using a soft cloth and glass cleaner.
3. Dry with a soft cloth.
4. Apply a thin layer of the stainless steel cleaning product to stainless steel surfaces using a soft cloth. You can obtain stainless steel cleaning products from the after-sales service or the online shop.

11.3 Cleaning controls and lights

⚠ **WARNING – Risk of electric shock!**

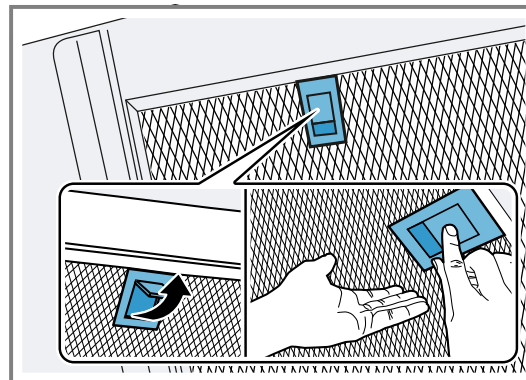
Penetrating moisture may cause an electric shock.

- ▶ Do not use wet sponge cloths.

1. Observe the information regarding the cleaning agents.
→ "Cleaning products", Page 10
2. Clean using a damp sponge cloth and hot soapy water.
3. Dry with a soft cloth.

11.4 Removing the grease filter

1. Take hold of the glass front in the centre and open it fully.
2. **ATTENTION** – Falling grease filters may damage the hob below.
 - ▶ Grip below the grease filter with one hand.
 Open the lock on the grease filter and tilt down the grease filter.



3. Remove the grease filters from the holders. To prevent grease from dripping, hold the grease filter horizontally.

11.5 Cleaning grease filters manually

The grease filters filter the grease from the cooking vapour. Regularly cleaned grease filters guarantee a high level of grease removal. We recommend cleaning the grease filters every two months.

⚠ **WARNING – Risk of fire!**

Fatty deposits in the grease filters may catch fire.

- ▶ Clean the grease filters regularly.

Requirement: The grease filters have been removed.

→ "Removing the grease filter", Page 11

1. Observe the information regarding the cleaning agents.
→ "Cleaning products", Page 10
2. Soak the grease filter in hot soapy water. Use special grease solvent for stubborn dirt. You can obtain grease solvents from customer service or the online shop.
3. Use a brush to clean the grease filters.
4. Rinse the grease filters thoroughly.
5. Allow the grease filters to drain.

11.6 Cleaning grease filters in the dishwasher

The grease filters filter the grease from the cooking vapour. Regularly cleaned grease filters guarantee a high level of grease removal. We recommend cleaning the grease filters every two months.

⚠ **WARNING – Risk of fire!**

Fatty deposits in the grease filters may catch fire.

- ▶ Clean the grease filters regularly.

ATTENTION

The grease filters may become damaged if they are squeezed in the dishwasher.

- ▶ Do not squeeze the grease filters.

Note: When cleaning the grease filter in the dishwasher, light discolouration may occur. This discolouration has no effect on the performance of the metal grease filters.

Requirement: The grease filters have been removed.

2. Place the grease filters loosely into the dishwasher. Do not clean heavily soiled grease filters with utensils. Use special grease solvent for stubborn dirt. You can obtain grease solvents from customer service or the online shop.

3. Start the dishwasher.

Select a temperature of no more than 70 °C.

4. Allow the grease filters to drain.

11.7 Fitting grease filters

ATTENTION

Falling grease filters may damage the hob below.

- ▶ Grip below the grease filter with one hand.

1. Insert the grease filters.
2. Fold the grease filters upwards and engage the locks.
3. Ensure that the locks engage.

Follow these safety instructions when installing the appliance.

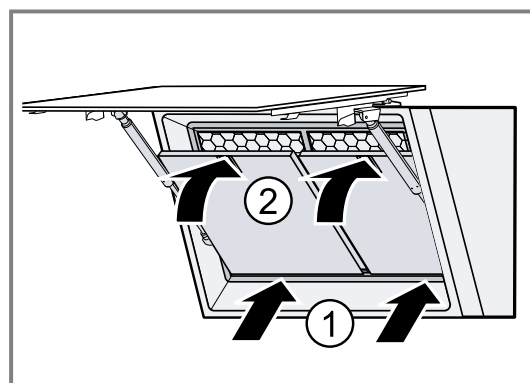


Plug connection to the glass plate

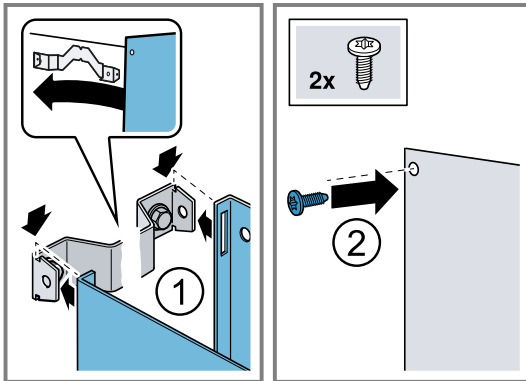

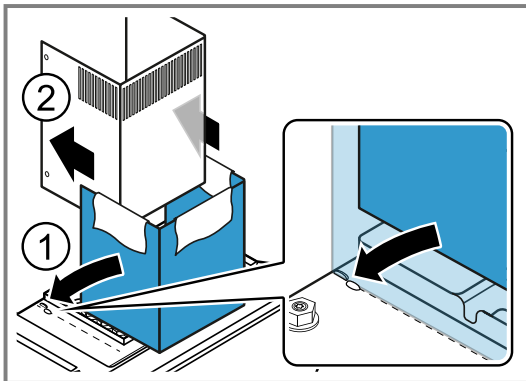
